## Why Cohesion Policy Is So Important

High youth unemployment rate in Europe has been one of the most adverse challenges throughout the last decades. Post-pandemic figures show that, as of October 2021, 2.905 million youth (under 25) were NEET (Not in Education, Employment, or Training) in the EU and the youth unemployment rate was $15.9 \%$. Unless appropriate measures are taken, more and more young people may disengage from active job search, and they may grow distant from the political and social life of their communities.

The EU Cohesion Policy is the main investment instrument in the EU - a powerful tool for financing jobs and growth, improving the quality of citizens' lives and creating solidarity and enhanced social, economic and territorial convergence and development in the regions of the EU. Cohesion policy is also key to combat climate change as it provides the place-based framework and the financial support needed to ensure that a "just" and "sustainable' transition becomes an opportunity for European regions.


## Tackling Education \& Employement

For the period 2021-2027, at least 27\% of the Cohesion Policy budget - around €99.3 billion EUR - will be allocated to investments under the European Social Fund +, which will be directed to education and training, more quality jobs, the fight against poverty and social exclusion and towards measures that promote social inclusion and equal opportunities for men and women, take good care of the disabled and give adequate protection to minorities. In other words, projects supported by these investments will make a real difference to the lives of our citizens.

Did you know? Cohesion policy now also includes a crisis-response mechanism for future crises to allow temporary measures for the use of the funds in response to exceptional and unusual circumstances, like a global pandemic or a natural disaster.

## What Solutions Are Being Found?

Support from the policy can include for instance measures to develop relevant employment services to promote the labour market integration of young people.

For example, a slovenian project ("Youth Transition") is supporting more than 2,000 young people with special needs - and reducing discrimination and social exclusion by helping them to make an easier transition from school to employment. In Slovenia, employers must employ a certain number of disabled people to fulfil mandatory quotas.

According to Youth Transition, this means that as many as 1,000 young people with special needs could be employed each year. So, with help from ESF funding, the project is making this easier for both employers and potential employees.
